In addition, our Communications department participated in a two-week Virtual College Fair event sponsored by Tribune Publishing. This was a national event and took place from March 4 – March 20, 2021. Along with available internship information, promotional videos were utilized to educate the students on SFPBS programming in hopes of recruiting interns.

Initiative Title: Job/Career Fairs

Description of Initiative: Human Resources representatives, who are responsible for the recruitment efforts for open positions at WPBT, WXEL or WURH and make hiring recommendations, attended the following job/career fairs during this reporting period:

-SUNY Purchase Virtual Job & Internship Fair, March 24, 2021

-Florida Atlantic University Virtual Job & Internship Fair, September 9, 2021

At these job fairs information was provided on available positions in addition to information relative to future opportunities to students. In addition, general station and broadcasting career information as well as information on internship opportunities are provided.

Attendance at two additional job/career fairs for the period ending September 30, 2020 is described in last year's report, meeting the required number of job fairs (4) in the two year term.

Initiative Title: PBS Newshour Student Reporting Labs Gwen Ifill Fellowship

South Florida PBS, Inc. serves as a mentor to local high schools involved in the PBS Newshour Student Reporting Labs initiative. This initiative hopes to build the next generation of public media journalists by connecting "students with a network of public broadcasting mentors, an innovative journalism curriculum and an online collaborative space to develop digital media, critical thinking and communications skills while producing original news reports."

In May 2021, we were approached by NewsHour Productions inquiring whether we would be interested in mentoring a Gwen Ifill Fellow either in person, remote and/or hybrid. This fellowship is in connection with the CPB funded PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs project, whose mission is to create a pipeline of talent within public media. We agreed and were approved to mentor and support Delta Flores as a 2021 Gwen Ifill Fellow.

During the summer of 2021, Delta Flores participated, remotely, as a youth reporter with the SRL. The goal of the project is to produce a story for digital, social, and possibly broadcast interstitial.

Delta participated in a number of socially distanced field shoots with us, including multiple days covering the emergence of young protestors rallying in the streets of Miami in support of the calls for change in Cuba. Delta interviewed young people at the various rallies we attended on Calle Ocho, and she used those interviews and an interview with the FIU Cuban Research Institute to craft a package that was broadcast on the PBS Newshour on Sunday, August 8, 2021.

In addition, Melissa Harmon, Director of Production, participated in a webinar with NETA on September 28, 2021 to let other stations know how they can engage with Student Reporting Labs this school year. She spoke about the importance of youth media and her work with SRL and how South Florida PBS thinks about our engagement with young people through the SRL.

Other Engagement with Schools and Community

April 8, 2021 -Alexa Elliot, Manager, Science & Environmental Content was a guest speaker in an Environmental Media Senior Capstone class at the University of Colorado, Boulder, taught by Cassandra Brooks, Ph. D. 25 students attended the talk and they learned about how our program Changing Seas, is produced and why.

March 26, 2021 – Alexa Elliot, Manager, Science & Environmental Content was part of a Zoom session with a third-grade class from the American School in Ecuador (Fundación Colegio Americano de Quito). Alexa spoke to the children about Humboldt penguins as they are learning all about animals, habitats, and human impacts.

Initiative Title: Employee Training

Sexual Harassment/Discrimination Training

South Florida PBS, Inc. continues its commitment to a workplace free from any form of discrimination and/or harassment. We conduct mandatory sexual harassment and discrimination training for all staff and interns annually.

In May 2019 we rolled out our current training model which utilizes an online compliance training company, Triliant, through which we have contracted for online Anti-Harassment and Anti-Discrimination training courses.

Each online course is comprised of bite-sized episodes presented in a Netflix-style news format. Episodes feature interactive videos that challenge employees to decide on the best approach to difficult, realistic work situations illustrating the different types of behavior that constitute sexual harassment such as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical harassment of a sexual nature. Employee also learn about sexual harassment outside the workplace, consensual relationships and how to identify a “hostile work environment” and “quid pro quo” as defined by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). The course also provides information on the corporation’s Workplace Respect and Complaint Procedures policies. The courses conclude with a question/answer session and a post training quiz.

Staff who supervise other employees were required to complete a 60-minute online course and staff that do not supervise others were required to complete a 30-minute online course. Staff were given 30 days to comply and complete the online course. We were able to track and follow up with staff in order to ensure 100% participation.

As new staff are hired, they are required to complete this online training course as part of their new hire orientation program.

KnowBe4 - Cyber Security Awareness Training

“Cybersecurity failures are at an all time high. With ransomware incidents, data breaches and data leaks, organizations need a comprehensive security awareness program which brings security programs an additional layer of security – the human layer” (Mikko Hypponen -Chief Research Officer at F-Secure).

In addition to our annual Sexual Harassment/Discrimination training, South Florida PBS, Inc. has also implemented annual Cyber Security Awareness training. This training is provided by KnowBe4, the world’s largest security awareness training and simulated phishing platform which helps organizations address the human element of security by raising awareness about ransomware, CEO fraud, and other social engineering tactics through a new-school approach to awareness training on security, effectively mobilizing their end users as their last line of defense.

The online course includes several interactive training modules, videos and games aimed at educating staff on the mechanisms of spam, phishing, spear phishing, malware, ransomware and social engineering and the potential impact these types of breaches can have on an organization.

We are able to track and follow up with staff in order to ensure 100% participation.
