Initiative Title: Job/Career Fairs

Description of Initiative: Monica R. Westby, HR Manager, is responsible for the recruitment efforts for open positions at WPBT and WXEL and makes hiring recommendations, attended the following job/career fairs during this reporting period:

At these job fairs information was provided on available positions in addition to information related to future opportunities for students. In addition, general station and broadcasting career information as well as information on internship opportunities are provided.

Attendance at two additional job/career fairs for the period ending September 30, 2024 is described in last year's report, meeting the required number of job fairs (4) in the two year term.

Initiative Title: Participation in scholarship programs designed to assist students interested in a career in broadcasting.

Flip the Script

Season 2 – Broward County

Season 1 – Palm Beach County

Originally funded by the Community Foundation of Broward, this initiative was created to support and empower high school storytellers from underserved communities across Broward County. Thanks to new funding from the Rickel Foundation, the program has now expanded into Palm Beach County, enabling students from both counties to create powerful films and stories that spark dialogue and help residents confront challenges within their communities.

We welcomed a new cohort of young storytellers who represent the breadth and depth of talent in the region, offering robust perspectives that reflect how deeply engaged students are with the complexities of today's world. The selection process was highly competitive. Ultimately, six students were chosen for Broward County (2 of which are working on 1 film project) and six students for Palm Beach County (2 of which are working together on 1 film project) to ensure a rich and diverse mix of stories and voices.

The selected Broward County participants come from the following schools:

- Dillard 6–12
- Sheridan Technical High School
- Lauderhill 6–12
- South Broward High School
- Pompano Beach High School

The selected Palm Beach County participants come from the following schools:

- South Tech Academy
- Olympic Heights Community High School
- Spanish River Community High School
- Atlantic Community High School
- Glades Central Community High School

Their proposed stories range from reflections on miscommunication in relationships and the experience of anxiety in high school, to cultural identity and the environmental legacy of a “100-Year Flood in a 100-Year-Old City.”

We approached this season with a more deliberate onboarding process to ensure the program's rigor and time commitment were fully understood by both students and their families.

We hired a highly respected educator and producer to facilitate the program and executed a robust marketing campaign—including targeted outreach to schools, after-school groups, and a refreshed video and social media push. We also conducted in-depth interviews with several applicants to

prioritize equity and ensure students from underserved backgrounds were centered in the selection process.

The Broward County participants completed filming in August and editing is under way. We anticipate the Palm Beach County participants filming to be completed by September 30, 2025 and will be in post-production in October. The Broward films are scheduled to premiere at the Ft. Lauderdale International Film Festival on November 8, 2025 and the Palm Beach films will premiere at the Subtropic Film Festival on November 9, 2025. All the films will premiere on-air on South Florida PBS sometime in the Spring 2026.

We're especially proud that this year's cohort includes a greater diversity in storytelling styles, with a mix of narrative and documentary formats.

Our goal is to continue to amplify unheard voices and provide youth in our community with the tools to share their stories—and inspire change.

Hosted by the Everglades Foundation and Friends of Manatee Lagoon, the event had approximately 65 participants.

Initiative Title: Training Program to Enable Station Personnel to Acquire New Skills

As South Florida PBS continues to expand its offering of immersive experiences, such as interactive exhibitions, live productions, and community events, we've held training sessions to enhance our team's ability to deliver high-quality, engaging, and technically sophisticated presentations.

Stage Precision – Core Skills Training – June 16-18, 2025

In June, we had select staff members participate in the *Stage Precision* training to deepen their technical expertise in managing and integrating real-time data systems across complex multimedia environments.

The *Exploration of Stage Precision* training program offers comprehensive instruction on utilizing the SP software platform to manage and integrate real-time data across complex multimedia environments. This training is particularly beneficial for professionals involved in live events, broadcast, immersive installations, and virtual production.

Our staff gained hands-on experience with the SP interface, learning to build and manage project environments, map live data streams, and navigate the software's user interface. A significant focus was placed on integrating multiple production pipelines, including real-time camera systems, sensor and motion tracking devices, media servers, lighting, audio, and environmental control systems. Staff learned to calibrate cameras and sensors to align virtual and real-world data, an essential skill for virtual and augmented reality applications.

DisguiseOne – August 13 – 17, 2025

In August, we had select staff members participate in the DisguiseOne training which focused on three areas within Disguise's Designer software providing both creative and technical foundations for delivering immersive video experiences, as follows:

Designer Essentials

The course introduced the full Disguise ecosystem, covering the software interface, hardware integration, and file management best practices. Staff learned to set up the Stage window, work in 3D space, and use timeline-based sequencing and transport controls. Additional topics included working with multiple media formats and codecs, managing layers (video and generative), and customizing the stage environment. Staff also gained skills in integrating LED screens, aligning virtual projectors, creating camera animations, advanced keyframing, and mapping workflows. The course also covered MIDI device setup, server roles in d3Net, 3D object animation, performance optimization, and exporting final outputs.

Creative Sequencing

This aspect of the course focused on building and controlling dynamic content through hands-on sequencing techniques. Staff learned video and image sequencing, setting up multi-transport systems, and configuring pro-audio output. It also covered the use of generative and effect modules, compositing live video inputs, and applying both static and dynamic mapping approaches. Additional skills learned included pixel and perspective mapping, linking MIDI controllers for interactive control, and advanced mapping techniques for more complex environments. In this area staff gained practical knowledge to create and manage visual projects inside Disguise.

Projection Mapping Techniques

This area involved learning advanced techniques for projection mapping on irregular and large-scale surfaces. Training included manual and dynamic blending for seamless projector overlap, warping and masking feeds, and edge refinement and feathering. Staff worked with visualization and rendering features such as LUX Render Mode for realistic light behavior, and anti-aliasing/face culling for optimized clarity. Surface mapping topics included UV mapping for precision on 3D objects and final projector calibration adjustments. Workflow guidance included exporting Projector Tables for technical teams, best practices for preproduction and execution, and using QuickCal for fast alignment. Finally, staff learned how to configure multi-machine environments with d3Net for larger setups.
